February is National Pet Dental Health Month. We all know the importance of maintaining healthy teeth and gums for ourselves as well as our pets. However, here are some fun facts about your dog's teeth that you may not know.

Adult dogs have a total of 42 of them, consisting of four different types. These include incisors, canines, premolars, and molars. The large canines attract the most attention. These fang-like teeth are so popular that even in other species, cats and humans for example, they are referred to as canines.

Puppies start out with 28 teeth and lack molars, since they typically do not have to grind food. At around four months of age, the adult teeth start pushing the baby teeth out. The incisors fall out first, then the canines at about six months, followed by the premolars. All that puppy chewing helps the process and eases the discomfort of teething.

When you wonder why dogs are such versatile eaters of almost anything-edible or not-it's by virtue of their teeth.
