2. Rescue Me!

It is not a situation any of us ever wants to experience. Nonetheless, when a fire engulfs a home, we as human beings know to get out of the house as quickly and safely as possible. The family pet, however, frequently will seek refuge by running and hiding from the fire.

To date, an estimated 60 million households in the U.S. have pets residing within them. There are no solid statistics as to loss of pet life due to fire or smoke inhalation. One thing on the horizon that is increasing the odds for Fido and Fifi's survival is a special oxygen mask. The mask is shaped like a cone and made out of a plastic material that is designed to fit properly over the pet's nose. The masks come in three different sizes and can be used on dogs, cats, guinea pigs, rabbits and even birds. The masks were originally designed for use by veterinarians and have now evolved as a rescue tool.

Firefighters in the past were faced with trying to make regular oxygen masks fit pets. While this can work, when time is of the essence, the pet oxygen mask is the best option.

While many fire departments already have the special pet oxygen masks on hand, many do not. Budget and cutbacks in spending can be offset by a donation to your local fire department. The cost is \$60 per 3 mask set.
